Aftermath Services Kicks Off the 2020 Safety & Training Contest For First Responders

Illinois-based biohazard remediation company will award 300 PPE kits and \$10,000 in funding to first responders for safety & training programs

AURORA, IL - On February 3rd, Aftermath Services LLC officially launched their annual <u>Safety and Training Contest</u>. Each year, Aftermath awards personal protective equipment (PPE) kits and funding to first responders nationwide to promote physical protection for those responding to biohazards, crime scenes, and other incidents involving bodily fluid spillage. This year, in addition to the PPE kits, \$10,000 total will be distributed to six departments to fund programs associated with keeping communities and first responders safe. These include active shooter drills, safety training programs, additional safety equipment, and more. The first-place winner will receive \$5,000 while five runners-up will receive \$1,000 each.

Additionally, 250 individual participants will be awarded their very own PPE kit. Individual winners will be selected at random from eligible entries, but the department with the most individual entries will get a free lunch on Aftermath.

Open to first responders nationwide, organizations can enter by submitting a 2-minute video that explains the importance of keeping officers and their families safe from unseen threats, such as bloodborne pathogens. All entries can be submitted online here. Entries for the Aftermath Safety & Training Contest will be accepted until February 28. The winners will be announced on March 3, 2020.

WHO: First Responders
