Aftermath Services Awards \$1,000 K9 Grant to California State Polytechnic University Police Department

Illinois-based biohazard remediation company gives back to partners in local law enforcement

Aftermath Services LLC awarded the California State Polytechnic University Police Department with a \$1,000 grant in [Aftermath's annual K9 Grant](#).
